Scottish Vocational Qualifications

SVQs are based on national standards developed by individuals working in industry, commerce and education.

SVQs cover a wide range of occupations, allowing candidates to demonstrate their competency to carry out occupational roles.

SVQs demonstrate four key aspects:

- How well a candidate can do their job.
- Candidate motivation, confidence and ambition.
- Levels of responsibility undertaken.
- How committed a candidate is to their occupation.

SVQs differ from other qualifications, as they allow candidates to be assessed at their place of work without formal written examinations, while continuing with their normal duties.

These are attractive to employers who continually look to invest in training and skills for their workforce, which in turn helps promote and improve their business.

In the following chart, you can see how SQAs link up with the SCQF Levels, recognised across Scotland.



The levels increase in complexity from one to five. Technical Academy Scotland specialise in delivering levels three to five. Edutrain international specialise in levels one to three – www.edutrain.co.uk

SVQ Level Breakdown

SVQ Qualification	Occupational Breakdown
1	SVQ level 1 covers occupations which involve a range of tasks which fall into a set pattern and do not change.
2	SVQ level 2 covers occupations which involve being competent in a range of activities in varying scenarios. They will be involved in the collaboration of work through group/team work.
3	SVQ level 3 covers occupations applying a broad range of activities in varying scenarios. These are often complex and non-routine tasks. In addition, the occupational holder may have some control, responsibility and provide guidance to others.
4	SVQ level 4 covers occupations applying a broad range of complex, technical or professional activities. The occupational holder will allocate resources and provide work for others. They will hold a position of substantial responsibility.
5	SVQ level 5 covers occupations applying fundamental principles and techniques to a high level of competence in unpredictable scenarios. The occupational holder will hold significant responsibilities, including: allocation of work and resource. They are accountable for: analysis, diagnosis, design, planning, execution and evaluation.
